- The facility is not reserved until a permit application has been submitted, with payment, and the approved permit has been returned to the permit holder.
- ❖ Permit applications should be submitted via person or mail to the Parks and Recreation Department at 75 E Lancaster Ave, Ardmore. Permits take at least 72 hours to process.
- * Keys are not issued for the Belmont Hills Community Center; the caretaker will open the facility for permit holders.
- ❖ Off street parking is available behind the community center. There are two legal parking spots in front of the building. Please be sure to adhere to all posted signs.
- ❖ Permit Change Requests and Refunds are accompanied by an Administration Fee.

Township of Lower Merion policy #23-09-92 states: Only Township based non-profit organizations (including public, civic, patriotic, charitable, philanthropic or private corporations comprised of 50% residents may apply for the use of a Township building, except for Appleford, the Ardmore Avenue Senior Center and Harriton House, which may be used by organizations or individuals which may or may not be Township based. Application for Appleford, the Ardmore Avenue Senior Center and Harriton House are completed directly with the Occupants/Board of Directors of each facility.
